DISCUSSION/ACTION/APPROVAL OF THE CANVASS OF THE VOTE FOR THE 2018 PRIMARY ELECTION

WPC Clerk Nichole Baldwin cited the hard copies and backup material available on the Canvass of the Vote for the 2018 Primary Election. She advised we had a 35% turnout, which was pretty good for a Primary. There were 1,766 total voters, of which 484 were early voters, 235 were absentee, 672 in person at the Bristlecone Convention Center and at the McGill Elementary School, and 375 voters turned in ballots. She continued it was a smooth election day; she and her staff worked out lots of bugs during the early voting period. The new software/equipment has been somewhat stressful, but with diligence everything was worked out. She thanked everyone who was a part of it, and that we couldn't have done it without everyone's help.

Commissioner Carol McKenzie asked what a "fled voter" was. Clerk Baldwin explained that we had 3 fled voters, 1 of which was during the early voting period; that's when someone takes the voter card out before casting their vote. She noted that during the Primary her staff made an effort to be aware of the people voting to ensure they don't go away or remove their card too soon. Commissioner Shane Bybee advised he had gone to the Bristlecone Convention Center and everything there appeared to be going smoothly. He was also impressed with the check-in process; he feels we have a really strong system, and commended Clerk Baldwin for doing a great job.

Vice-Chairman Shane Bybee entertained a motion for approval. Commissioner Steve Stork made a motion to approve the Canvass of the Vote for the 2018 Primary Election. Commissioner Carol McKenzie seconded. Motion carried.
